Anticipation Guide - STRATEGIES

An anticipation guide is a strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading a selection, students respond to several statements that challenge or support their preconceived ideas about key concepts in the text.

Activating Strategies for Use in the Classroom

The Anticipation Guide is a pre-reading strategy that assesses what students know before beginning the lesson or reading. Students must use any prior-knowledge or background information they have to answer a set of around 3-5 brief questions about a specific topic or concept.

Students' interest and curiosity will be sparked when this strategy is used correctly. Guided Comprehension: Previewing Using an Anticipation Guide

Anticipation/Reaction Guide. An Anticipation/Reaction Guide utilizes a twin strategy to increase reading comprehension: stimulate prior knowledge and experiences before reading and then reinforce key concepts after reading. The guide presents students with a series of leading questions to be answered in writing before reading.

Anticipation/Reaction Guide - Reading Educator

Anticipation Guides (Herber, 1978) are typically a list of statements related to a topic that act as scaffolding for student understanding of the text. Students indicate if they agree or disagree with each of the statements.
