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Assessment Of Psychoses

Patients with psychosis secondary to drug use or medical causes often present with altered vital signs, visual hallucinations, and severe cognitive impairment, including confusion or disorientation. The assessment of psychosis includes a physical examination, a complete psychiatric and medical history, and a laboratory work-up.

Assessment. Formal systems for the diagnosis of mental illness (1,2) describe a number of different types of psychotic disorder, including: Schizophrenia (psychotic illness has been continuing for at least 6 months, with at least 1 month where symptoms were active)

Psychotic Disorder Assessment & Treatment

Initial assessment should consist of a complete physical and mental state examination. Important features in the general examination that may help to identify specific causes of psychosis include: Fluctuations in the level of consciousness, suggesting delirium.

Acute psychosis is a medical emergency; apart from distress and behavioural dysfunction, there may be danger to the patient and others. Urgent assessment and management is essential.

Schizophrenia requires lifelong treatment, even when symptoms have subsided. Treatment with medications and psychosocial therapy can help manage the condition. In some cases, hospitalization may be needed. A psychiatrist experienced in treating schizophrenia usually guides treatment.

Calgary Depression Scale for Schizophrenia (CDSS): The Calgary Depression Scale for Schizophrenia (CDSS) is the only questionnaire designed for the assessment of depression in schizophrenia, and it differentiates between depression and the negative and positive symptoms of schizophrenia. It has nine questions that are answered on a 0-3 scale.

Assessment Tools for Measuring Outcomes in Psychosis Psychotic Symptoms – Symptom Severity 1) Revised Behavior and Symptom Identification Scale (BASIS-R). The BASIS-R is a 24-item self-report instrument with six scales: psychosis, depression/functioning, interpersonal problems, alcohol/drug use, self-harm, and emotional lability. 2)
