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### **Gliomas Symptoms Diagnosis And Treatment**

In addition to actions to remove the tumor itself, treatment for glioma may also require using drugs to reduce the signs and symptoms of your tumor. Your doctor may prescribe steroids to reduce swelling and relieve pressure on affected areas of the brain. Anti-epileptic drugs may be used to control seizures.

Symptoms. The symptoms of glioma vary by tumor type as well as the tumor's size, location and rate of growth. Common signs and symptoms of gliomas include: Headache; Nausea or vomiting; Confusion or a decline in brain function; Memory loss; Personality changes or irritability; Difficulty with balance; Urinary incontinence

Glioblastoma can occur at any age, but tends to occur more often in older adults. It can cause worsening headaches, nausea, vomiting and seizures. Glioblastoma, also known as glioblastoma multiforme, can be very difficult to treat and a cure is often not possible. Treatments may slow progression of the cancer and reduce signs and symptoms.

Gliomas — including Glioblastoma multiforme (GBM), anaplastic astrocytoma and oligodendroglioma — are best treated with a team approach. This typically includes minimally invasive surgery, targeted medical therapies & radiotherapy. The initial optimal treatment for most gliomas is maximal surgical removal.

Glioblastoma is a type of astrocytoma, a cancer that forms from star-shaped cells in the brain called astrocytes. In adults, this cancer usually starts in the cerebrum, the largest part of your brain.

Surgery for Gliomas. Surgery is the most common initial treatment for gliomas. A biopsy taken during surgery provides tissue samples to the pathologist, who will then be able to make an accurate diagnosis of the tumor's composition, which is critical to getting the best treatment. Surgery can also allow for the removal of tumor tissue to relieve pressure in the brain caused by the tumor.

Glioblastoma multiforme (GBM) (also called glioblastoma) is a fast-growing glioma that develops from star-shaped glial cells (astrocytes and oligodendrocytes) that support the health of the nerve cells within the brain.. GBM is often referred to as a grade IV astrocytoma. These are the most invasive type of glial tumors, rapidly growing and commonly spreading into nearby brain tissue.

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
