CASE 1 A 20 year old man with no past medical history presented to a primary stroke center with sudden left sided weakness and imbalance followed by decreased level of consciousness. Head CT showed no hemorrhage, no acute ischemic changes, and a hyper-dense basilar artery. CT angiography showed a mid-basilar occlusion.

Hemorrhagic Stroke: Symptoms, Treatment, and Long-Term Outlook

Epidemiology • Globally, the incidence of stroke due to ischemia is 68 %, while the incidence of hemorrhagic stroke (intracerebral hemorrhage and subarachnoid hemorrhage combined) is 32 %. • Men have a higher incidence of stroke than women at younger but not older ages, with the incidence reversed and higher for women by age 75 years and older.

Intracerebral Hemorrhage Case presentation

1) Brain non-contrast CT (Figure 1) showed a large right frontal intraparenchymal hemorrhage with 7-mm midline shift and partial effacement of the basilar cisterns. 2) Brain CTA showed the appearance of an apparent AVM supplied by the anterior cerebral arteries with superficial drainage at the superior sagittal sinus.

Risk factors for hemorrhagic stroke includes age, gender, race, hypertension, smoking and use of illicit drugs. A stroke causes a wide variety of neurologic deficit, depending on the location of the lesion, the size of the area of inadequate

Prospective cases were captured through the Calgary Pediatric

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Stroke Program (2007-2014). Participants included term neonates with magnetic resonance imaging-confirmed NHS including primary and secondary intracerebral hemorrhage, hemorrhagic transformation of ischemic injury, and presumed perinatal hemorrhagic stroke. Control infants with common data were recruited from a population-based study (4 to 1 ratio).

Smoking Causes Fatal Subarachnoid Hemorrhage | Stroke

Hemorrhagic strokes are further classified as intracerebral or subarachnoid. Systemic hypertension and other cardiovascular diseases are common risk factors for both ischemic and hemorrhagic strokes. Clinically, strokes are characterized by the acute onset of focal neurologic deficits, including hemiparesis, paresthesias, and hemianopsia. The pattern of clinical features is dictated by the affected vessel.
