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10 Best Strategies for Infection Prevention and Control

Infection control - occupational exposure to body fluids. If you come in contact with blood or body fluids: Flush the area with running water. Wash the area with plenty of warm water and soap. Report the incident to the appropriate staff member. Record the incident via the Disease/Injury/Near Miss/Accident (DINMA) reporting procedure.
