Score the wallpaper using a wire brush. Mix up your remover following the instructions on the packet. Pour into a paint tray and roll onto the walls, making sure the paper is nice and wet. Use a paint scraper to scrape away the wallpaper. Reapply and soak hard to remove areas. When all paper is removed rinse the wall with water.

Step 1. Wash the walls with a mixture of wallpaper paste remover or 1 part vinegar to 4 parts water, to remove all remaining wallpaper glue. Scrub them with a rough cloth or abrasive sponge, then rinse them with clear water and clean rags. Allow the wall to dry.

Wash the walls with TSP and water, which will clear away dried glue globs and any other remnants. Make sure you give your walls a thorough rinse afterwards.

Then, use your rigid scraper to pry a corner of the wet wallpaper and backing off of the wall (Image 2). Pull the wallpaper off in sheets and drop large pieces into the trash can (Image 3). Work the entire surface while it's wet. You may find that some wallpaper or backing has dried and become more difficult to remove. Ignore the dried wallpaper and focus on removing the still wet pieces.

Some newer homes use removable wallpaper, also called temporary wallpaper.
